Membership is dwindling but it remains a lifeline for its community. “A quietly hilarious film” which follows this group of friends and their perhaps unrealistic dreams. (UK)</p>		<p>23rd July **</p> <p>A science fiction movie about a family who question love, connection and loss after their AI robot-child, Yang, malfunctions. In the process of repairing Yang, the father discovers he needs to reconnect with his family. (USA)</p>
	<p>19th March/AGM</p> <p>A 2013 film about a young woman who discovers her roots and the truth about her family, then has to choose between her birth identity and the religion that saved her from the massacres of the Nazi occupation of Poland. (Poland)</p>		<p>20th August + Brewery Night</p> <p>A single woman pushed to her limits finally gets an interview for a job which would change her life, but then has to deal with a national railway strike which threatens her new position. (France)</p>
	<p>30th April ** + Brewery Night</p> <p>A husband and wife employ an apprentice in their tailoring business and find their own relationship challenged by his arrival. (Morocco/Arabic)</p>		<p>17th September</p> <p>Two men making an (illegal) living find new, affluent parents for babies left anonymously in boxes are pursued by a woman who wants her baby back. (South Korea)</p>
	<p>21st May</p> <p>Based on historical events in Arnhem Land just after WW1. In a bid to save the last of his family, a young Aboriginal man teams up with an ex-soldier with his own secrets. (Australia)</p>		<p>15th October + Brewery Night</p> <p>Isolated in a small village in the Outer Hebrides before WW1 and young girl’s life changes dramatically when tragedy befalls her. Based on a true story. (UK)</p>
	<p>18th June + Brewery Night</p> <p>The story of Sir Hekenuikumai Ngaiwi Puhipi who helped to rekindle their wayfinding DNA and to reclaim NZ’s place as traditional star voyagers. (New Zealand)</p>		<p>19th November + Xmas Party 26th Nov</p> <p>Escaping an abusive relationship a young mother, frustrated by the public housing system, sets out to build her own home and in doing so rediscovers herself. (UK)</p>
